

GENERAL INFORMATION

History of Landmark Baptist College

In January of 1971, the First Missionary Baptist Church in Haines City, Florida needed a new pastor and they called Mickey Carter to come take the position. After Pastor Carter accepted the pastorate, his first message was based upon Proverbs 29:18a, "Where there is no vision, the people perish." Thirty-seven people were present that day. Since then, although the church has grown in attendance, it is still characterized by a vision, growth, and an intense outreach that is constantly expanding. In 2009, Sunday School attendance averaged over 1,200 a week with a high day of 4,240.

Within the first few weeks of Pastor Carter's arrival, a bus ministry was started. Pastor Carter started the first three bus routes and over the years the bus ministry has grown to as many as 17 bus routes. The first of many, this outreach program was started for the sole purpose of carrying the good news of the Gospel not only to Central Florida but throughout the world.

Throughout the years, various other ministries have been instituted to carry out the church's commitment to aggressive evangelism, the infallibility and preservation of the Word of God, Christian education, and the preservation of our Baptist heritage. These ministries include the Landmark Christian Elementary, Junior High, and High school, the Freedom Baptist Homeschooling Curriculum, Camp Glory (a beautiful 50-acre wooded Christian camp four miles from the church), the operation of a church radio station (WLVF 90.3FM - both Internet and airwave), the Senior Patriots ministry, Landmark Baptist Senior Retirement Village, and many more.

In 1979, the original name of First Missionary Baptist Church was changed to Landmark Baptist Church. Based upon Proverbs 22:28, "Remove not the ancient landmark, which thy fathers have set," this change shows the church's commitment to remain strong and stand firm as a light for all of central Florida and the greater surrounding areas.

During that same year, Pastor Carter was burdened to found a college dedicated to the same principles upon which the church was built. For over thirty years, Lndmark Baptist College has successfully trained pastors, Christian school teachers, evangelists, missionaries, and other local church staff for service in the ministry of our Lord.

In 1993, the college published *Things That are Different are Not the Same*. This book was written by Pastor Carter in defense of the King James Bible and against its critics. Throughout the years, Landmark Baptist College has become a leader in the study and defense of the King James Bible in a time when even many evangelicals are attacking it.

In 1997, Landmark Baptist College moved forward in growth and expansion. The historic, ten-story Palm Crest Hotel in downtown Haines City was obtained and renovated for use as a college campus. Since then, LBC has also obtained

additional facilities that have provided a greatly increased number of dorm rooms, classrooms, a beautiful chapel, bookstore, social parlor, snack shop and recreation room, along with many other benefits.

Throughout the years, Landmark Baptist College has led the way in fighting for all Bible colleges in Florida that they may be able to retain religious freedom. In 2002, a great victory was won when a major amendment was passed in the state of Florida, securing religious liberty for all Bible colleges across the entire state.



Doctrinal Statement

Landmark Baptist Church and College is proud of its Baptist doctrine, practice, and heritage. We are proud to defend the fundamentals of the faith, and we support without compromise the old King James Bible. We believe in aggressive evangelism, the preservation of God's Word, Christian Education and the local church.

A Bible Baptist is one who believes in a supernatural Bible, which tells of a supernatural Christ, Who had a supernatural birth, Who spoke supernatural words, Who performed supernatural miracles, Who lived a supernatural life, Who died a supernatural death, Who rose in supernatural splendor, and Who will one day return in supernatural glory to establish a supernatural kingdom on earth.

THE BIBLE

We believe the Bible to be the inspired, the only infallible, authoritative Word of God and that He has preserved it for the English-speaking world in the Authorized King James Version. (Please see the following section for our stand on the King James Bible)

THE GODHEAD

We believe that there is one God, the source, support, and end of all things, eternally existent in three persons: Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

THE SON

We believe in the deity of our Lord Jesus Christ; in His Virgin Birth; in His sinless life; in His miracles; in His vicarious and atoning death; in His shed blood; in His bodily resurrection; in His ascension to the Father's right hand; and in His personal, premillennial return for His saints and with His saints at the Revelation.

FALL OF MAN

We believe that man is totally depraved, a sinner (lost) by nature and by divine decree, therefore in need of the convicting and regenerating ministry of the Holy Spirit.

SATAN

We believe in the personality of Satan; in his power and kingdom; in his wiles; and in his judgment at the cross and his eternal destruction in Hell.

THE HOLY SPIRIT

We believe in the present ministry of the Holy Spirit; that He convicts the sinner; regenerates the one who believes; indwells, seals, instructs, reproves and guides the believer; that He fills and controls every life that is wholly yielded to Him. However, we are not Pentecostals or Charismatic.

FREENESS OF SALVATION

We believe that salvation is the gift of God offered to man by His grace and received by personal faith in the Lord Jesus Christ.

THE RESURRECTION

We believe in the bodily resurrection of the saved unto "life" and the unsaved unto "iudament" and everlastina damnation.

THE CHURCH

We believe that a Scriptural church is a visible assembly of baptized believers, covenanted together under the New Testament for the purpose of carrying out the Great Commission. The church is a self-governed, independent body having Christ as the Head, the Holy Spirit for its guide, and the Bible as the only rule of faith and practice. The only Scriptural offices of the church are the bishop (or pastor) and deacons. The two ordinances of the local church are Baptism and the Lord's Supper.

CREATION


We believe in the special creation of the existing space-time universe and all its basic systems and kinds of organisms in the six literal days of the creation week and in the full historicity and perspicuity of the Biblical record of primeval history. This includes the literal existence of Adam and Eve as the progenitors of all people, the literal fall and resultant divine curse on the creation, the worldwide cataclysmic deluge, and the origin of nations and languages at the tower of Babel.

SEPARATION FROM THE WORLD

We believe that all the saved are called unto a life of separation from worldly and sinful practices. A person who has truly accepted Christ as Saviour is a new creation in Christ; therefore, he should live a holy, consecrated life. He should separate himself from the world and all its lust in obedience to God's command.

King James Bible

We believe that the Holy Bible was written by men supernaturally inspired; that it has truth without any admixture of error for its matter; and therefore is, and shall remain to the end of the age, the only complete and final revelation of the will of God to man, the true center of Christian union and the supreme standard by which all human conduct, creeds, and opinions should be tried.



We believe that the Holy Bible is the verbally plenarily inspired product of God the Holy Spirit. Further, we hold that God has given and preserved for us that which was originally written in the King James Authorized Version and we hold the KJAV to be without error. This statement of faith can in no way abrogate or amplify our true authority, which is the King James Bible Itself. The KJAV to which we refer

contains 66 books that were supernaturally written, and we do not refer to any other version or book. It is therefore necessary that no other book be preached or taught. The King James Bible which we hold in our hand is God's perfect word (The Holy Scripture) and is our final and absolute authority in all matters of faith and practice. The doctrine of inspiration and preservation cannot be separated. They are just as divinely linked as Grace and Faith.

Landmark Baptist College considers it inappropriate to ask a non-Christian educational system to accredit Bible college training. Landmark Baptist College is further unwilling to make the compromises in academic excellence and spiritual standards necessary to obtain the approval of the world.



Admission Information



Student Personal Qualifications

Landmark Baptist College is a Baptist college. All students should understand that Baptist doctrine, Baptist distinctives, and Baptist polity will be taught. Students who cannot accept this have no place at Landmark.

Landmark Baptist College admits students of any race, color, disability, and national or ethnic origin to all the rights, privileges, programs, and activities generally accorded or made available to students at the college. It does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, disability, national or ethnic origin in the administration of its educational policies, admissions policies, scholarship programs, and athletic or other school-administered programs. The pastoral program is limited to men because of the Biblical qualifications of the pastor found in I Timothy 3.

Students must be born again Christians.

Students must desire to receive further training to serve in the Lord's work wherever He wants them.

Students are expected to read the Bible and pray daily, win souls, tithe to their local church, and participate in their church missions program. Haines City Campus students (who do not come from a church within driving distance) are expected to become active members of Landmark Baptist Church.

Students are expected to participate in the annual Soulwinning Marathons, including all prior training and preparation sessions.

Students must cheerfully abide by the separated, disciplined standards of Landmark Baptist College.

The student should understand that attendance at Landmark is a privilege and not a right. This privilege may be revoked if the student does not conform to the standards and regulations of Landmark Baptist College. Student dismissal is a reserved right of Landmark Baptist College if, in the opinion of the administration of Landmark Baptist College, the student does not conform to the standards and regulations of Landmark Baptist College.

The King James Bible is the basis for all classroom teaching, chapel messages, and student assignments at Landmark Baptist College. Students who cannot accept this have no place at Landmark Baptist College.

Eligibility for Admission

Admission to Landmark Baptist College is predicated upon graduation from high school or the successful completion of the GED test or the High School Equivalency Examination.

Application Procedures

FIRST TIME STUDENTS:

Please use the following checklist for submitting your application to Landmark Baptist College:

- Obtain an Application for Admission. Applications are available on the college website (www.landmarkbaptistcollege. com), by e-mailing the admissions office at admissions@ landmarkbaptistcollege.com, or by calling (863) 422-6493.
- Complete the Application for Admission and attach a recent photograph of yourself. Complete the Student Questionnaire.
 Send the completed application, student questionnaire and \$50.00 non-refundable application fee (payable to Landmark Baptist College) to:

- Complete the first section of each recommendation, then give the three forms to the appropriate individuals. Each form should be completed and mailed directly to Landmark Baptist College. The Application for Admission will not be processed until all recommendation forms are received.
- Complete a Transcript Request Form as follows:

High School Level – If you have not yet graduated, request your high school to send a transcript of course work completed to date. If you have received a Graduation Equivalency Diploma (GED), please have the official record sent directly from the testing center.

- College Level If you have completed more than 25 credits at the
 college level, your high school transcript is not required; however,
 your college transcript is required for admission. An official transcript
 from the student's previous college(s) is required for transfer of credits.
- Complete the front of the Student Health Form. The back of the form is to be completed by a health care professional. The completed form should be mailed directly to Landmark Baptist College. This form is not required for Directed Studies Program applicants.

TRANSFER STUDENTS:

Please complete all the steps listed under FIRST-TIME STUDENTS.

SPECIAL ADMISSIONS:

The mature student who cannot meet the above requirements, may be admitted on a probationary status. Successful completion of the first year of college indicates the student's ability to benefit from the program and will result in his being removed from a probationary status.

FOREIGN STUDENTS:

Foreign or international students may apply for admission to Landmark Baptist College. Foreign students must comply with all regulations and requirements of the Department of Homeland Security, as well as Landmark Baptist College.

An I-20 form is required by the Immigration and Naturalization Service. These are obtainable through the Dean of the College, Landmark Baptist College. This form indicates to the INS the student's financial support, verifies that the applicant has been accepted as a student at Landmark Baptist College, and indicates that the student may be eligible for a student visa.

International students should not come on a visitor's visa.

If you should have any questions regarding international study here at Landmark Baptist College, please feel free to contact the Dean of the College Office for further information.

PROVISIONAL STUDENTS:

A student who wishes to take only a few courses at LBC and who is not working toward a degree may be accepted as a provisional student without meeting all of the normal student qualifications. This status is granted at the discretion of the college administration and may be revoked at any time.

Tuition and Basic Fees

FULL-TIME TUITION

The tuition rate for a full-time student, a student taking more than 11 credit hours, is \$1,600 tuition up to 18 credit hours. The hourly rate of \$100 per semester hour will be charged for each credit hour over 18 in addition to the regular tuition fee. On-campus dormitory students are required to take no less than 12 credit hours, unless special permission is granted by the College.

PART-TIME TUITION

Students taking fewer than 12 semester credit hours are considered part-time students and will be charged the rate of \$100 per semester hour.

COURSE AUDIT

Courses may be audited for a fee of \$20 per credit hour. Audited courses are taken for no credit and no grade is given for the course. Students auditing courses will be subject to normal fees.

DORMITORY FEES

Dormitory fees are \$600 per semester. Single students under the age of 25 are required to live in the dormitory unless they are living with someone in their immediate family who is 35 years of age or older. Single students over 30 years of age are not permitted to live in the dorms and are required to find housing within the area. Students staying on campus during the interim or off-semester periods will be assessed a weekly \$80 room fee. Breakfast, lunch, and dinner are not included in the dormitory fees but are available through the college for approximately \$9 a day.

APPLICATION FEE

A \$50, non-refundable, application fee must accompany any application for admission to Landmark Baptist College.

REGISTRATION FEE

A non-refundable registration fee of \$300 per semester is charged to each full-time student (12-18 undergraduate credits or 9-12 graduate credits). Part-time students will be charged a \$125 Registration Fee.

SOUL WINNING MARATHON FEE

All spring semester students are required to participate in our annual Soul Winning Marathon held at a local Baptist church within driving distance of the college. A mandatory Soul Winning Marathon Fee of \$200 is due to help defray the expense.

VEHICLE REGISTRATION FEE

A vehicle registration fee of \$10 is required for every vehicle that will be parked on campus. Upon payment, a vehicle registration sticker will be issued and must be placed in the bottom left corner of the windshield.

GRADUATION FEE

A \$200 graduation fee is required of all graduating seniors. The graduation fee includes the expense of the diploma, diploma cover, purchase of academic regalia, and additional costs associated with the graduation commencement.

SUMMER SESSION

Summer sessions are held on a modular basis consisting of two or three week classes. Tuition for summer classes will be charged at the rate of \$100 per semester credit hour. Students choosing to register for the entire summer session are considered full-time students and are required to pay a \$125 Registration Fee. Students who are not planning to take the entire summer session are required to pay a \$75 part-time registration fee. Students staying in the dormitories will be charged \$80 per week. Students staying on campus at any time during the summer must be attending college classes. Students who do not keep their account current will be asked to leave.

LOST KEY FEE

A \$25 fee will be charged for any dormitory key that is lost. The fee covers the expense of replacing the necessary doors with new locks.

TRANSPORTATION FEE

Landmark Baptist College does not provide regular transportation to or from Haines City and surrounding areas. If a student is in need of transportation, a \$25 fee will be charged to cover fuel and vehicle expenses. This fee would include transportation to and from Orlando International Airport.

MISCELLANEOUS COSTS

The cost of books and school supplies may vary depending upon the course of study, subject, and the number of hours attempted. This cost may range from \$100 to \$300 per semester. Textbooks are available in the LBC Bookstore. Laundry, personal supplies and incidentals, vary dependent upon each student.

TERMS OF PAYMENT

A student's account must be paid up-to-date before he may take mid-terms or final exams, graduate, and/or receive grades, reports, and/or transcripts. It is understood that these terms are accepted as part of the contract by the student

and his parent or guardian when he makes application for admission and is accepted as a student at Landmark Baptist College. Landmark Baptist College costs are subject to change without notice.

JOINT SPOUSE PROGRAM

The wife of any full-time student will not be charged tuition to take classes. All normal fees will apply at the full rate. For further details, please contact the Financial Affairs Office

WITHDRAWAL AND REFUND POLICY

Any student who does not cancel his reservation at least one week before the formal beginning of the semester for which he is enrolled must pay 20% of the full semester's tuition within thirty (30) days. After a student has enrolled in the college, any action that would cause the student to leave the college before routine completion of the semester (voluntary or involuntary) will be considered a withdrawal.

To withdraw from the college with official approval, a student must have a withdrawal form properly executed by the appropriate dean. A student whose withdrawal is officially approved before the end of the first four weeks of the semester will be refunded fees and tuition according to the following schedule:

A student is entitled to a full refund of tuition prior to commencement of instruction if the student submits a written request to the college and he never attends class. A dormitory student is required to pay the necessary dormitory fee at a pro-rated amount based on the length of his stay.

Whenever a student's status is changed to "withdrawal" and the student owes money to the college, the money is due upon withdrawal. The student will not be allowed to return to LBC until all past bills are paid. No transcripts or other records will be released until all bills are paid.

Should a student leave the college for any reason after having paid more than the amounts outlined above, a refund is made to him for any overpayment. No other refund is made to a student for any other reason. No refunds are issued on a student's account until after the third week of school has been completed.

Financial Aid

Students at Landmark Baptist College are not eligible for government-sponsored grant or loan programs due to our religious convictions. As an alternative to the government sponsored programs, the following scholarships are available to students attending the Haines City Campus.

FIRST YEAR FREE SCHOLARSHIP

As a ministry of Landmark Baptist Church, it is our desire to see young people give the first year after high school to the Lord. Whether the student chooses to continue their education at LBC, or elsewhere, they will have a firm, Bible foundation to build on. This scholarship allows the student to attend the first year of college without paying tuition. Registration, room, and students fees are the only cost required.

FIRST STUDENT SCHOLARSHIP

The first student to enroll from a Baptist church which has not had a student at Landmark Baptist College within the last ten years is eligible. The scholarship, in the amount of \$1,000, will be applied to the tuition for the student's second consecutive year at Landmark Baptist College. The amount will be awarded in two increments of \$500 each semester.

ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIP

A student enrolling at Landmark Baptist College who graduated from high school with a 3.5 grade point average (on a 4.0 scale) or having a composite ACT score of 25 or higher or a total SAT score of 1150 or higher is eligible. The scholarship, in the amount of \$1,600, will be applied to the tuition for the student's second consecutive year at Landmark Baptist College. The amount will be awarded in two increments of \$700 each semester.

MINISTRY SCHOLARSHIP

A student whose parents are in full-time Christian service with a fundamental, independent Baptist church is eligible. This would include, but is not limited to, pastors' children and children of missionaries. The one time scholarship, in the amount of \$1,000, will be applied to the tuition for the student's second consecutive year at Landmark Baptist College. The amount will be awarded in two increments of \$500 each semester.

WORK/STUDY ASSISTANCE

A limited number of on-campus jobs are available for students. Credit for hours worked is applied directly to the student's college bill for tuition and dormitory fees. Due to the limited number of positions available, students interested in this program should complete a work/study assistance application early.

SCHOLARSHIP AVAILABILITY

A limited number of scholarships are available each year. Students who are interested should apply early. Scholarships may not be combined or used in succession of one another. All scholarships listed above are only applicable to students who have been accepted for admission and whose fees are paid.

Any student receiving a scholarship from Landmark Baptist College must maintain a satisfactory academic standing and keep his college account current.

Scholarships available through LBC are not applicable to video classes or the Directed Studies Program.

VA Pending Payment Compliance


In accordance with Title 38 US Code 3679 subsection (e), this school adopts the following additional provisions for any students using U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) Post 9/11 G.I. Bill® (Ch. 33) or Vocational Rehabilitation & Employment (Ch. 31) benefits, while payment to the institution is pending from the VA. This school will not:

- Prevent the student's enrollment;
- Assess a late penalty fee to the student;
- Require the student to secure alternative or additional funding;
- Deny the student access to any resources (access to classes, libraries, or other institutional facilities) available to other students who have satisfied their tuition and fee bills to the institution.

ACADEMIC INFORMATION

The Landmark Baptist College Education

Whether they go on to work in full-time Christian service or as a faithful layman in a local church, it is our goal to prepare the hearts of our students to serve the Lord. With that goal in mind, each course of study has been developed with a strong emphasis on the Bible, local church ministry, and the student's personal walk with the Lord. Each degree also includes foundational general education courses taught from a Christian perspective.

THE BIBLE

It is our desire that each student develop a deep love and appreciation for the Bible, our sole Authority. Thus, It is the primary focus of each course of study at Landmark Baptist College. Each student will gain a broad knowledge of the Bible, as well as the skills needed to rightly divide It. Some Bible courses each student will experience are Bible Doctrines, Inspiration of Scripture, Old & New Testament Survey, Biblical Interpretation, and Bible Exegesis courses covering specific books of the Bible.

LOCAL CHURCH MINISTRY

Along with experience serving in the ministries of Landmark Baptist Church, our practical theology classes give each student a foundational knowledge of the ministries in the local church. These classes include Personal Evangelism, Bus Ministry, Sunday School, Basic Church Music, Biblical Counseling, and Christian Ethics (men)/ Christian Womanhood (ladies).

PERSONAL WALK WITH GOD

We believe the most important part of the Bible-college education is learning to have a personal walk with God. It is our desire that our students not just serve, but that they love the Lord Jesus Christ. Some classes that help develop the student's personal Christian life include Fear of the Lord, Prayer, Bible Study Methods, and Life of Christ.

GENERAL EDUCATION

It is important that each student has an accurate Christian knowledge of general studies. To ensure this, each student is required to take the following courses: Christian Philosophy of Education, Baptist History, United States History, World History, English Grammar & Composition.

ASSOCIATE OF ARTS IN BIBLICAL STUDIES ASSOCIATE OF ARTS IN CHRISTIAN WOMANHOOD

BACHELOR OF ARTS IN BIBLE - BIBLICAL STUDIES

This major of study is for men who are unsure of the call of God in their life or just want a thorough, well-rounded Bible college education. This Bible degree gives students a sound doctrinal foundation along with a strong college education.

BACHELOR OF ARTS IN BIBLE - PASTORAL STUDIES

This course of study is for men called of God to preach and pastor a church. The degree prepares the future pastor with the spiritual, practical, and theological tools necessary in the ministry. Courses specific to this degree include Homiletics, Practice Preaching, Pastoral Theology, Advanced Pastoral Theology, Church Administration, and Church Polity.

BACHELOR OF ARTS IN BIBLE - MISSIONS

This program is for men and women called to reach the lost on the mission field. Whether that field is home or abroad, this degree will train and equip the student to do the work of God on the mission field. The courses for this degree will include Missionary PPM (Principles, Practices and Methods), Cross Cultural Ministries, Deputation Ministry, and Cults/Comparative Religions.

BACHELOR OF ARTS IN BIBLE - LOCAL CHURCH MINISTRIES

This degree is for men who have been lead by the Lord to the position of an assistant pastor, youth director, evangelist or other ministries of the local church. The student will choose one of the following concentrations: Youth, Evangelism, Church Technology, Church Media, and Radio Broadcasting*. Courses will include Second Man, Evangelism, Outreach Ministries, Youth Ministries, and Children's Ministries.

BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN CHRISTIAN BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION

This course of study provides a foundation for a variety of opportunities in Christian and secular business. The degree will provide a foundation for accounting, economics, commucation, marketing, and general business principles.

BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN CHRISTIAN OFFICE ADMINISTRATION

This course of study prepares ladies for full-time Christian service as secretaries. Studies in this field include office procedures, computer applications, business communication, and marketing.

BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN CHRISTIAN ELEMENTARY EDUCATION

This program prepares the student to minister in a Christian school at the elementary and middle school level. The student will learn general teaching methods, as well as, techniques specific to each of the core subjects (Math, Science, History, and Language Arts). General teaching courses will include Christian Philosophy of Education, Methods & Materials, Tests & Measurements, Classroom Management and Practice Teaching. The student will also be required to complete a semester of student teaching.

BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN CHRISTIAN SECONDARY EDUCATION

This program prepares the student to minister in a Christian school at the high school level. Along with the general teaching courses, the student will take proficiency courses in History along with one of the following selected proficiencies: Math, Science, or English. Other proficiencies, such as Music, Art, Graphic Design, and Computers, may be permitted based upon student interest and course availability. The student will also be required to complete a semester of student teaching.

BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN CHRISTIAN STUDIES - (INTERDISCIPLINARY)

This program allows the student to earn a two-year Bible College education and proceed to learn a trade at a local community or state college or another approved college near the student's home. Possible interdisciplinary subjects could include Nursing, Aviation, Criminal Justice, and Business Administration. Other disciplines subject to approval.

ONE- OR TWO-YEAR BIBLE CERTIFICATE

The Bible Certificate Program at Landmark Baptist College provides a foundation of Bible knowledge that is vital to every Christian's ability to share and defend the faith. This program is ideal for the high school graduate that is uncertain of what college or career path God may have for them, or the mature church layman who may not have had the opportunity to attend Bible college. Consisting mainly of the Freshman Core Curriculum (excluding English courses) the program will provide an opportunity to learn the fundamentals of Bible study, ministry, the local church. Each of these classes can be applied to any undergraduate degree program at Landmark Baptist College if the Lord leads for further training.

Degree Requirements

Each student must take the following courses from Landmark Baptist College: Personal Evangelism, Baptist History, and Inspiration of Scripture I & II. These must be completed before receiving the student's first degree from Landmark Baptist College.

ASSOCIATE

An Associate degree requires the completion of 66 credit hours as approved by the College Administration.

BACHELOR

A bachelor's degree requires the completion of 132 credit hours as described in the catalog and approved by the College Administration.

GRADUATE PREREQUISITES

To enter the Pastoral Studies or Theology graduate programs, the student must have (or obtain) twenty-four (24) hours of undergraduate credits in Bible and/or Practical Theology. To enter the Christian School Administration, Elementary Education, Secondary Education, Bible College Administration, or Christian Education graduate programs, the student must have (or obtain) twelve (12) hours of undergraduate credits in Bible and twelve (12) in Education.

MASTER

A master's degree requires 30 graduate-level credit hours above a bachelor's degree plus a thesis or 36 graduate-level credit hours without the thesis as approved by the College Administration. A Master's Thesis is a minimum of 50 typewritten, double spaced, 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ by 11 pages. The topic of the thesis must be pre-approved by the College Administration.

DOCTOR OF MINISTRY

The Doctor of Ministry degree requires the completion of 48 graduate-level credit hours beyond a Master degree as approved by the College Administration.

DOCTOR OF PHILOSOPHY OR DOCTOR OF EDUCATION

A Ph.D. or Ed.D. degree requires 64 graduate-level credit hours beyond a Master degree as approved by the College Administration plus a Doctoral Dissertation on a topic pre-approved by the College Administration. A limited number of Ph.D. applications will be accepted.

FRESHMAN CORE CURRICULUM

General Academic Information

UNIT OF CREDIT

The unit of credit is the semester hour. A semester hour is one 50-minute period of instruction, per week, for 15 weeks (or the equivalent of such time).

TRANSFER OF CREDITS

Landmark Baptist College joins with private and public collegiate-level institutions, both in Florida and nationally, in agreeing to accept transfer credits which apply to specific programs offered. Each institution of higher learning reserves the right on an individual student basis to determine what transfer credits it will or will not accept. Therefore, no institution of higher learning can guarantee 100% transferability of credits to another. Landmark Baptist College graduates and/or transferring students have successfully transferred credits to many other institutions of higher learning.

Landmark Baptist College will consider transfer credits earned in a regular college or university with collegiate-level instruction. Only credits with a grade of "C" or above may be transferred. Student grade-point average for graduation at Landmark Baptist College will be based solely upon credits earned at Landmark Baptist College. Landmark Baptist College reserves the right to withhold recognition of credits that, in the opinion of the Administration, do not meet reasonable academic criteria.

EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING CREDITS (ELC'S)

Experiential Learning Credits (ELC's) may be applicable if documentation is submitted by the student. This will consist of a biographical/chronological resume of prior experience and learning, providing the person has a minimum of ten years Christian Service and/or work experience. The granting of ELC is predicated upon the student's matriculation and completion of a degree program; therefore, ELC's are not available on a transcript until the student graduates from LBC.

PROGRAM EVALUATION

A student or Administration may request a program evaluation at any time during a student's tenure at Landmark Baptist College. A program evaluation includes determination of the program, ability to continue or maintain requirements of a selected program, the transfer of credits, and the applicability of Experiential Learning Credits (ELC's).

GRADING SYSTEM

Course grades will be determined by the compilation of all tests, memory work, term paper grades, and any other assignments given during the course session, according to the value scale established by the professor and applied equally to all students in the class. All courses must be completed by the semester's last class day for undergraduate and graduate students. Exceptions can only be granted through the approval of both the Dean of the College and the Academic Dean.

A student must achieve a final grade point average of 2.00 (at least twice as many grade points as credit hours attempted) or higher for all courses taken at Landmark Baptist College in order to satisfy the grade-point requirement for graduation. Graduate students (both Master's and Doctoral) must achieve a final grade point average of 2.75 or higher in order to satisfy the grade-point requirement for graduation.

STUDENT LOAD

The normal full-time undergraduate student load is 16-18 credit hours per semester. The normal full-time graduate load is 9-12 credit hours per semester.

MAXIMUM COURSE LOAD

A maximum course load is 20 credit hours. This maximum credit total includes extra credit, correspondence, and/or Directed Studies course work in which a student is currently enrolled. Students must have approval from the Academic Dean to exceed the load limit. The student load requirement for his major, as well as his ability to maintain a grade-point average of 2.00 or above while completing the program of study, will be taken into consideration.

IRREGULAR SCHEDULING

Landmark Baptist College cannot guarantee to schedule courses for the convenience of individual students who cannot or do not take courses in their regularly scheduled sequence.

REGISTRATION

Registration time for each semester is listed on the Landmark Baptist College calendar. Students registering after the registration deadline each semester must pay a late registration fee.

SEMESTERS

Landmark Baptist College has a term of two regular semesters of instruction (Fall and Spring) and summer modular sessions when offered.

COURSE CHANGES

Additions

A student may add a course to his schedule (after obtaining approval) during the drop/add period each semester. An add-course fee will be charged.

Drops

Courses dropped (with approval) during the drop/add period will not show a failing grade. A grade of "F" will be recorded on courses dropped after the drop period. A drop-course fee will be charged.

Withdrawals

When circumstances force a student to withdraw from Landmark Baptist College, a withdrawal form must be properly executed. A withdrawal deemed honorable by the Academic Affairs Office will have an honorable withdrawal recorded as "W". All dishonorable, unregistered withdrawals will be recorded as failures.

COURSE CANCELLATION

Any course with insufficient enrollment may be canceled at the discretion of the Administration.

ACADEMIC CLASSIFICATION

Regular Student:

A student working toward a degree that has satisfied entrance or continuance requirements.

Non-degree Students:

Non-degree students will be classified as follows:

Undergraduate students not working toward a degree will be classified according to number of credits.

Diploma (non-degree) students working toward a diploma will be classified according to number of credits.

Post-graduate Special:

A student with a bachelor's degree taking further undergraduate courses will be a Post-graduate Special Student.

Part-Time Student:

Student enrolled for less then 12 credits per semester.

CLASS STANDING

Freshman

A student who has completed less than 33 credits.

Sophomore

A student who has completed 33 credits, but less than 66 credits.

Junior

A student who has completed 66 credit hours, but less than 99 credits.

Senior

A student who has completed 99 credits.

ACADEMIC PROBATION

If, at the end of a semester, a student fails to maintain a 2.0 semester GPA, the student will be placed on academic probation. Any student determined to be on academic probation will be notified of this action in writing by the administration. The student will be allowed to continue on a semester-by-semester basis under the condition that he maintain a 2.0 GPA each semester. When their semester GPA reaches 2.0 or better, the student will be removed from academic probation.

ACADEMIC SUSPENSION

If a degree student fails to maintain a 2.0 GPA while he is on probation in any semester, he will be suspended for one semester. After the period of suspension, a student may re-enroll on probation. The previously discussed probation procedures will be followed.

Alternate Option:

If the administration determines that an individual student's ability to benefit is at a non-degree level, the student must switch to a non-degree program.

If a degree student reaches the point of being suspended a second time, the student will be dismissed from Landmark Baptist College. A student who has been dismissed may not re-enroll for at least a year.

REJECTION, SUSPENSION, EXPULSION

A student may be rejected, suspended, or expelled for failure to comply with:

- 1. Student Personal Qualifications
- 2. Standards and Types of Eligibility for Admission

- 3. Application Procedure
- 4. Student Agreement

TRANSCRIPT OF RECORDS

There will be no charge for the first transcript after graduation. Transcript requests must be submitted in writing, signed, and accompanied with a transcript processing fee of \$5.00. Transcripts cannot be issued if a student's account is not paid in full.

EDUCATIONAL RIGHTS AND PRIVACY

A student's record is confidential. The student record includes the following: student's name, address, birthplace, date of birth, sex, admission classification, credits transferred, all courses taken at Landmark Baptist College with credit hours, grades, grade point averages, academic probation, suspension, or dismissal, field of study, degrees earned, and graduation dates.

Transcripts of a student's record are released only on the student's written authorization. The administration will maintain a permanent record on any student who has attended Landmark Baptist College.

PREREQUISITES


Each student will be required to pass the English and Math placement exams. Failure to pass will result in the taking of remedial courses and could put the student in jeopardy of completing the degree as scheduled.

STUDENT TEACHING

The second semester of the student's senior year will consist primarily of student teaching. The student will experience the teacher's position first-hand including: the normal teaching cycle, achievement testing, special days, parent-teacher meetings, proper handling of parent situations and student home visitation.

PROGRAM DISMISSAL

Continuation in the Christian Education program is subject to yearly evaluation. Both academic and non-academic qualifications of the student will be taken into consideration.



Bachelor of Science in Christian Studies - (Interdisciplinary)

Graduate Studies

The purpose of the Landmark Baptist College master's and doctorate programs is to provide students with an advanced Bible college education for the goal of preparing them to be pastors, administrators, teachers, and biblically sound layman. The student will be well qualified, both spiritually and academically, to lead and to serve in the local church, the Christian school, local church ministries, and other professions both in America and throughout the world.

Each graduate program places a greater responsibility on the student. The curriculum of the graduate programs will allow the student to research the subject matter giving a greater knowledge of the material and, in doing so, better equipping the student for the ministry. A greater responsibility of leadership will also be expected in the matter of Christian service and ministry.

PREREQUISITES

An undergraduate degree from an approved college or university will be required for acceptance into the graduate program. A minimum number of undergraduate credits are required for each graduate program. A student pursuing a graduate program in the education field is required to have an undergraduate degree in education. Please see the details of each graduate degree concerning the number of undergraduate credits required.

*Students who have not completed Baptist History, Personal Evanglism, and Inspiration of Scripture I/II at Landmark Baptist College will be required to complete these courses as part of their graduate requirements. General electives will take the place of these classes for those who have completed them through Landmark Baptist College.

MASTER'S THESIS AND DOCTORAL DISSERTATION

Students pursuing a master's degree are required to complete a fifty (50) page thesis on a topic in the field of study. The student will be assigned a faculty mentor to assist in the proper completion of the thesis. All topics are subject to approval by LBC Administration. Upon approval by the administration, a student may complete 6 masster-level credits in place of completing a thesis.

Students pursuing the Doctor of Philosopohy or Doctor of Education, are required to complete a two hundred and fifty (250) page dissertation on a topic in the field of study. The dissertation is to be completed at the end of the program. All topics are subject to approval by LBC Administration. The doctoral dissertation will be reviewed and approved/denied by the LBC Dissertation Committee.

Master of Arts in Pastoral Studies

The Master of Arts in Pastoral Studies provides a more in-depth study to prepare students to effectively preach and teach the Bible, as well as, perform the necessary pastoral duties in the local church. Both intensive biblical studies and practical theology studies are included in this program.

DIRECTED STUDIES INFORMATION

Directed Studies Distance Learning Program

The Directed Studies Program has been designed for the self-motivated, mature student who desires to complete his degree and cannot attend classes on campus at Landmark Baptist College. The DS program allows the full-time Christian worker, the actively employed, the military personnel

currently serving in the armed forces, and the busy Christian to receive a fundamental Bible college education. Although nothing can take the place of being in the classroom, LBC has developed the most efficient and practical distance learning program possible.

Landmark Baptist College brings traditional college courses to you on digital copy or DVD. Each student is taught by the same professors, textbooks, materials, and exams used at the Haines City Campus via the recording of actual classes. Through the



use of actual professors on video and in-field test proctors, your work earns college credits rather than correspondence credits. Degrees are conferred at Landmark Baptist College, Haines City, Florida.

Each Directed Studies course is taken one-at-a-time at the convenience of the student. Tests and quizzes are administered by an LBC-approved test proctor in the student's local church (pastor or appointed staff member). Each student is given 4 months (undergraduate) or 6 months (graduate) to complete the class and course requirements. Upon which time all loaned material, such as DVDs or select textbooks, are returned.

DEGREES OFFERED

Most undergraduate and graduate degrees offered by Landmark Baptist College are available through the Directed Studies Program.

FULL-TIME STUDENT PACKAGES

Full-time Student Packages are available to students who wish to take a full-time course load of 12-18 credit hours. Each package is catered to the student's degree and allows the student to graduate in a more timely manner. Directed Studies semesters are 6 months in length and do not have to coincide with the on-campus schedule. Full-time student semesters are not available for graduate studies.

COURSE REGISTRATION FEE

Registration fees include all textbooks and course outlines. Single course registration fees must be paid in full at the time of registration. The Full-Time Student Semester fee may be paid in three equal payments with first payment due at time of registration. First time students are required to pay a \$20 new student fee. Registration fees are as follows:

DIRECTED STUDIES CENTERS

Directed Studies Centers are held in a local, fundamental, Baptist church under the supervision of the pastor/designee. This group study creates a learning environment and interaction involving other students. Any local, fundamental church pastor who is in agreement with the tenets and practices of Landmark Baptist Church and College may inquire and qualify for starting a Directed Studies Center. A church must have at least five students to qualify.

DIRECTED STUDIES PROCEDURES

- All Directed Studies students must complete the entire application process and be officially accepted by the college prior to registering for their first course. Upon acceptance, a list of available Directed Studies courses and a registration form will be sent to the student.
- Full payment is required at the time of registration. The student must also submit the name and address of a test proctor, normally the pastor or appointed staff member, who will administer the tests. LBC reserves the right to offer substitutions for classes not available at time of registration.

- After registration, course materials, textbooks, and videos are sent to the student to begin the course. The student's proctor will receive a test packet with the tests, quizzes, instructions, and pre-stamped envelopes to return the completed material for grading.
- All course requirements must be submitted and DVDs (when applicable) returned by the designated due date for the class to be complete.

OTHER PROGRAMS AVAILABLE

The Directed Studies Program also offers Pastoral Refresher Courses, Layman Courses, and a One- or Two-Year Bible Certificate. The Christian Soldier Program offers a considerable discount to those currently serving in the military. Please contact Landmark Baptist College for more information.
